

HAND CUT DOVETAILS SHAKER DINING TRAY

With the traditional furniture revival there is renewed interest in the dovetail joint. It not only looks good, but is the method for end of board joining. You may be familiar with modern router cutting, with the increasingly sophisticated jigs for a range of layouts. However, what has served craftsmen for centuries is the hand cut dovetail joint using just basic shop tools; saw and chisel.

Come to the Home Shop class and remove the mystery and master your skill in making a Shaker classic. We start by making handy layout gauges for both hardwood and softwood. Layout is suitable to the project, so educating your eye for proportion is part of the skill set.

The Shaker dining tray has contrasting cherry ends and lacewood sides to emphasize your accomplishment in joinery. You can feel the pride of the traditional work.
